TUSHAR KUNDU ('13)

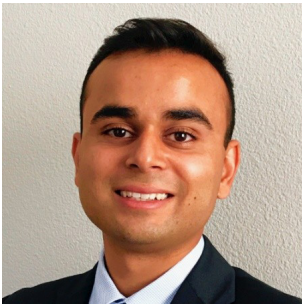
Graduated: Swarthmore College
